A letter from our Vicar, Revd. Pete Williams

Hello!

Peace is a beautiful thing.

We take it for granted here in England, never having to concern ourselves with missile attacks from a near neighbour.

What is happening in Israel & Gaza at present is heartbreaking. The death, destruction & sorrow unfathomable to us.

Through this past summer I read Max Hastings' book, "Catastrophe", the story of 1914, and the lead up to, and first months of World War 1. The scale of the numbers of casualties, and the scope of the destruction are just mind-boggling.

And last weekend, while attending a service in Winchester Cathedral for the licensing & commissioning of lay workers in the church, I took a moment to look at the memorial book to those from Hampshire and the Isle of Wight who lost their lives in war. The single page that was open contained fifty names, from Charles F. Collier to Frank W. Cushion. Fifty sons, brothers, fathers (they were all male), from this county, with last names between Co and Cu...

All were lost between 1940 and 1945.

How many other names must be in that book?

In November every year we remember.

At the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month, to mark the Armistice signed between the Allies and Germany, bringing an end to hostilities on the Western Front at 11 o'clock on November 11th, 1918, we're called to pause what we're doing and remember the terrible cost of war.

Part of the reason we do this as a society is so that in recognising the cost,

we think twice about entering conflict again, and search all avenues for peace.

However, we do seem to have let the importance of remembering slip. In preparing for our Remembrance service this year, I read the following by Bruce Kent, who knew this area well from his campaigning for nuclear disarmament at RAF Greenham Common: "(as a child) no matter what day of the week it was, at 11 am exactly, everything stopped. Pedestrians stood still. Cars, buses, and carts stopped where they were. A great silence fell on busy London."

As I stated at the beginning, peace is a beautiful thing. Let's do all we can to mark Remembrance this year. November the 11th is a Saturday – what will you do to remember the horror of war, and to be thankful for peace?

On Sunday 12th, we'll have our service of Remembrance at St. Pauls, starting at 10:50 am, maybe you'll come along this year?

ASHFORD HILL - A TARGET FOR SPECULATIVE DEVELOPERS?

NOT FOR THE MOMENT

The Appeal Hearing for the development in the "Holt Cottages field" took place on Tuesday 3rd October. It was a long and frustrating day. As I came out of the Council offices at the end of the day, our planning consultant, Mike de Courcy, said to me: "I think we might just have won the argument." I was told we would have to wait 6 to 8 weeks to hear the conclusion.

The RAAD committee met to plan for the next Hearing set for Thursday 19th October. We now felt pretty well prepared but planned a final dress rehearsal for the Wednesday evening.

With the Hearing only 24 hours away, the Inspector had not yet issued her draft agenda. In the previous one, we had received it 3 days in advance. That worried me. Something was not quite right.

On that Wednesday morning, I was having a golf lesson. My phone rang just as it was beginning. It was my daughter, Melissa: "Dad, the decision is out. It seems we have won."
Only 2 weeks gone. Wow! Fantastic news.

My phone kept ringing; calls from ecstatic colleagues. I finished my lesson and went home to read the published decision and was delighted to find that he had comprehensively over-ruled the proposal and had backed the Council's and our objections. The gratifying fact is that Mr Chamberlain acknowledges our input and it is pretty clear that without it, the Decision might have gone the other way.

Early on that Wednesday afternoon, I received a call from Jason at the Council to say that the developer for the 47 houses next to the Antler development had pulled out. So, we had won that one as well. If he had been in the room, I would have leapt up and given him a hug!

I don't think we are Nimbys. We argued that Ashford Hill is genuinely not the right place for sustainable development and the Inspector agreed. I want to say a few thank you's. First, to Christian & Nicola Bearman, who, from day one, agreed to stand with Heather and me in employing Mike de Courcy, a local planning consultant to advise us. Without their support, we might not have gone it alone.

Of course, I next must thank Mike. It was he who told us that the key issues would be about the sustainability of the site. No public transport; pretty much no local services; thus requiring all residents to use cars to get to those services. We owe Mike a great deal for his steady and wise counsel.

Next, I must thank my daughter, Melissa, who had the bright idea to create a name for our action group around which we could coalesce. Melissa has also been brilliant in managing our WhatsApp group.

Of course, I must thank the members of our steering committee, which included Ken Rhatigan, Paul Clark, Julian Sunley and Peter Cunningham. They have been constant supporters; have read reams of reports and have given thoughtful input into crafting our arguments. In this group, we should include John Kirkby, Anne Ayres and Ann Rixon who have given of their time and emotional capital. Without this group, we would not have won.

Thank you also to those people who responded to Melissa's request for help in funding the costs of additional consultants. Your support and generosity is hugely appreciated.

And thanks to those of you who took to our streets to get your neighbours to sign RAAD support forms and to those of you who did sign up. THANK YOU.

We have shown that given the right cause, we can as a village come together. Our next cause is to have a celebratory party before Christmas. We will be in touch on that one quite soon; and hope to see you there.

Recipe for November

Here is a great dish to set you up for a busy day out in the cold. It's really simple and is very easily adapted to using up leftovers. If you have a good bubble and squeak recipe, then that's great but add the spices and coriander as they really make the dish. I hope you enjoy it.

Serves 4

Ingredients

600g desiree potatoes, chopped into large chunks

- 4-5 tbsp olive oil
- 1 onion, finely chopped
- 1 tbsp yellow mustard seeds, toasted in a dry pan
- 1 tsp ground cumin
- 1 tsp ground turmeric

200g spinach

4 very fresh, large free-range eggs

Small bunch fresh coriander, roughly chopped

For the stir-fried kale

1 tbsp olive oil

200g kale

2 garlic cloves, very finely sliced



Method

- 1. Heat the oven to 200°C/180°C fan/gas 6. Put the potatoes in a large saucepan, cover with boiling water from a kettle, then simmer for 20-25 minutes until tender when pierced with the tip of a sharp knife.
- 2. Meanwhile, heat 1 tbsp of the olive oil in a medium frying pan and fry the onion until soft and translucent. Add the mustard seeds, cumin and turmeric and cook for 2 minutes more, then set aside.
- 3. When the potatoes are cooked, drain well, return to the pan, then mash until smooth. Put the spinach in a large colander and pour over boiling water from a kettle to wilt it. Press the spinach into the colander with the back of a spoon, squeezing out as much water as possible.
- 4. In a large mixing bowl, mix the mashed potatoes, spiced onions and spinach with a generous pinch of salt and pepper, then form the mixture into 8 even-size cakes. Heat 2 tbsp of the oil in a large frying pan and fry the cakes, 4 at a time, for 3-4 minutes on each side until they have a bit of a crust, then carefully lift onto a baking tray in a single layer. You may need to add more oil to the pan. When all are fried, put in the oven and bake for 15 minutes.
- 5. Meanwhile cook the kale. Wipe the pan clean, then heat 1 tbsp oil over a high heat and fry the kale, stirring occasionally, for 7-8 minutes until the kale is tender but still has a slight bite. Add the garlic for the last 2 minutes, then taste and season.
- 6. For the poached eggs, fill a large saucepan or large deep frying pan with water and bring it to a very gentle simmer the water should barely be moving. Crack the eggs into the water and poach without touching for 3-4 minutes. Remove the eggs with a slotted spoon onto a plate lined with kitchen paper. Serve 2 cakes per person topped with an egg and some coriander, with the stir-fried kale alongside.

And as I'm writing this... it would be outstanding served with some hot natural smoked haddock! Now I'm really hungry.

Jobs in the Garden for November

What a wonderful growing season we have just had. Although we all complained about the lack of sun this summer, the plants all loved it. Most things grew in abundance, both vegetable and flowers. Roll on next season!

I already have a few seeds in hand and the garlic and onion sets are in the ground. About two thirds of the vegetable patch is dua-over in readiness for mulching early next spring and the spring bulbs are all in their pots. It will soon be time to bring in all the soft plants for protection from the frosts. My fuchsias and other soft plants are all gathered in the greenhouse just in case of an early frost. After the strange winter last year many of the plants, which appeared to have succumbed to the two frosty/cold periods, have regrown from the roots including the climbing rose which appeared dead until the end of August when I took a mattock to it to remove the root to find four or five strong shoots coming from the root area. There you go, patience does pay!

Here are a few jobs for us to do this month.

Lawns

- If the weather is still warm, the grass may require a high trim, perhaps number 4 or even 5 on the mower settings
- Scarify and autumn feed the lawn if not already completed
- Level out some of the bumps where necessary and fill in the dips with old compost from the summer pots if you have lots of spent compost
- Aerate the damp spots to try to avoid moss over the wet season. A garden fork does the trick to a depth of around 6ins. Give it a good wiggle to open out the holes. Lots of exercise here for the avid gardener

- It is too late to repair with seed, just in case anybody was thinking of this. It's expensive turf now or nothing
- Try to keep off the grass over the winter especially when wet or after a frost

Shrubs and Roses

- Now is the time to begin planting all shrubs and roses you may have been dreaming of over the summer. Use Root-Grow when planting expensive shrubs and roses. It really does work well. I have tried it with some late spring planting of standard roses and have been amazed at the rate of growth
- The summer shrubs should all have been trimmed into shape over July and August and should have made plenty of new growth since then. Don't touch them now, or else there will be no flowers next year
- When planting new shrubs and roses, use lots of garden compost in the bottom of the holes and 4ozs of fish/blood/bone or just bone meal mixed in with the compost. The hole should be approx twice the size of the root ball. After planting, firm the soil, leaving a dip around the growing stem to collect water and apply a good gallon/5ltrs of water from a can
- Cut back and tie in the climbing roses.
 There has been lots of good new growth over the summer. Tie the stems as near to the horizontal as possible. This encourages the spring growth to grow vertically into the supports
- Give all the shrubs and roses a good feed of fish/blood/bone or bone meal at 2ozs per sq.m
- Trim back the bedding roses by about half, leaving a few outward pointing buds to finally cut back to next spring, cut out all the weak stems. This will help avoid wind rock over the winter

 Take hardwood cuttings of your favourite shrubs and roses. Cut a 12 ins deep slot with a digging spade in a well-drained position. Dip the cuttings into rooting hormone or gel and insert into the slot. Add plenty of sharp sand into the slot to aid drainage prior to insertion of the cutting. Then pray, but it does work for around 50% of the cuttings

Flower Borders

- The big tidy up starts here, unless you favour leaving all the old growth to provide winter shelter for the plants and small animals
- Cut back the old growth to about three ins and collect all the general detritus from the border. Fork the soil around to aid drainage and feed all the perennials with approx. 2ozs per sq.m
- If there has been a frost, cut back the dahlias to about 3ins and dry off the tubers and over winter in a frost proof place. Remove all the hairy roots and sprinkle with sulphur to help avoid fungal-attacks
- Protect any semi-hardy perennials with fleece or wood shavings covered with straw over the root area, e.g. hardy fuchsias. A wire enclosure is handy to avoid the insulation material blowing all over the garden
- Split and replant the best bits of your favourite perennials

Tubs and Containers

 Most of the containers should be free from the summer plantings and available for winter bulbs and hardy spring flowers.
 Add 2ozs of bone meal or f/b/b to each 10 or 12 ins pot, and stand the pots on drainer feet or strips of timber

- Plant the spring tulips
- All the half-hardy perennials, (fuchsias and geraniums, etc.), should now be stored in a frost free greenhouse

Vegetable Garden

- · Plant garlic, autumn onion sets etc.
- · Harvest leeks, parsnips, Brussel sprouts
- Start the winter digging on wet, eavy ground

In the Greenhouse

- Keep an eye open for frosts and turn on the anti-frost heaters
- Reduce watering to a minimum, just enough to keep the plants turgid, perhaps watering once a month
- · Remove any dead leaves to avoid fungus
- On sunny days, open up the vents to provide air circulation. Close off again at night
- · Keep the glass as clean as possible

We had Alan Hogan visit the Garden Club for the October meeting. His topic was 'Pests and Diseases 'and covered identification and prevention of the problems we face in the garden, especially with soft fruit.

Ambling around - By Old Double Decker Buses

Now that it's my turn to write the article I've been persuaded to change the angle - as you can see from the title!

In 1973 when I was 20 I got to know a bunch of people in Liphook who had two double decker buses. Both were British Levland the first was made in 1948 and was ex Portsmouth Corporation, the group of friends called it "Hairy Pillock", converted it into a "motor caravan" and drove it to Spain and back.

Flushed with their success they got carried away, bought a 1949 ex Warrington bus with a 10 litres engine. converted it, called it "Hairy Pillock 2 and 9 of them took two and a half years to drive it around the world. Along the way they created a folk group called The Philanders and even performed for the Shah and Empress of Persia en route. Back to me. I was too young for all this but duly obtained my PSV licence and drove parties of people on holiday down through mainly France, Spain and Italy. It was an amazing experience as everywhere we went people couldn't believe their eves and I became quite au fait at repairing punctures (invariably an inside rear), replacing broken injector pipes. dealing with slipping clutches and every other mechanical problem that threw itself at us. Mind you, in those days there were BL dealers everywhere

so between them and scrap yards obtaining spares wasn't too bad except in the middle of nowhere which is usually where we were when we wanted them.

The other big issue was (and still is) low bridges or cables. We had a length of wood which if one particular guy held up in the air came to the roof of the bus so if we came to an overhead cable on an electric railway crossing we used to let him go in front and measure it whilst the rest of us stood well back!

Moving on, increasing work and family commitments got in the way of bus driving though my love of motorcycles provided my road fun.

Eventually though after I had retired I was asked to re-join the group and share the driving with others who were also insufficiently geriatric to do so.

I had a practice with two trepidations, one whether I could remember how to double declutch an old crash gearbox without crunching it and secondly if I had the strength to work the two foot wide non power assisted steering wheel. However, the main challenges proved to be climbing up into the cab and getting my stomach under the steering wheel!

Since then I have driven a number of trips both in this country plus a tour of north and south Ireland and Normandy which was particularly poignant for me as I was able to visit Gold Beach where my father landed as part of the D-Day Invasion and I also drove over (the replacement) Pegasus Bridge that was captured as a vital part of securing the area.



Anyway, I hope you have enjoyed this "special edition" of Ambling About, I've included a couple of photos, one from my early days featuring Hairy Pillock 1. can you work out which one is me? The second is from a more recent trip and features Hairy Pillock 2 and an older, shorter, stouter me!

Might as well own up!














News from Ashford Hill Primary School



Mr J Woodford (Chair), Mrs K Saunders (Vice Chair), Mr S Hoskins, Mr P Clark, Mr S Dunn, Mr J Sunley and the Clerk, Mr S Marshall.

Cllr Mellor, Cllr Rhatigan and Cllr Morrow were also present together with members of the public.

1. Apologies

Apologies had been received from Cllr Parker and Cllr Bound.

2. Declaration of interest

There were no declarations of interest.

3. Minutes of previous meeting for approval

The minutes of the meeting held on Monday 12th June 2023 were approved.

4. Matters arising

Matters arising were dealt with under the individual Parish Councillors' reports.

5. Highways

The Chair reported again on his specific concern of the green waste fly tipping in the layby nearest to Ashford Hill House and in general the problem with fly tipping as a result of a local facility not being available.

The Chair further commented on the fact that road signs installed as a result of the recent diesel spillage were still in situ.

Cllr Hoskins had reported significant potholes associated with a road drain on the Ashford Hill Road, located at a dangerous bend of the road near to Goose Hill.

7. Reserves Policy

The draft Reserves Policy recently sent to Councillors was proposed to be adopted by the Council by Cllr Saunders, seconded by Cllr Sunley and approved to be adopted by all those Councillors present.

8. Reports

County Councillor

Cllr Mellor reported that only one school in the county had reported the presence of RAAC type cement. A review of waste recycling centres and the percentages of household waste that is currently recycled, would be undertaken but Cllr Mellor reiterated that there was not a new recycling centre "on the horizon". The County's planned bus services were in place and there is now no longer the prospect of a community

service in the villages of Ashford Hill and Headley. The County Council is consulting with its electorate as to the services it most values in order to identify where savings on the cost of services could be made. Cllr Mellor informed the meeting that funding from the County Councillor grant scheme was still available. The vast majority of parents had been able to secure the first choice of secondary school for their children. Cllr Mellor had noticed the minutes reflecting issues with bikers and horse riders using footpaths and informed the meeting that the County Council had 'Walkers only' signage freely available.

Borough Councillors reports

Cllr Bound's and Cllr Morrow's reports had been previously received. Cllr Rhatigan provided the meeting with an update on the various issues relating to several developments in the villages.

Chair of the Parish Council

After 8 years of serving as Chair of the Parish Council, Cllr Woodford had decided to resign as Chair earlier than previously indicated and would be relinquishing the role at the end of the December 2023 meeting of the Parish Council.

Parish Councillors

Cllr Saunders reported on the positive feedback from residents concerning the improved access along certain footpaths.

Cllr Dunn had received one quotation for the repairs to the 84 metres of fencing around the playground in Headley and would be obtaining an alternative quote to ensure the value for money criterion was being achieved.*

An issue reported regarding the emptying of bins on Headley recreation ground would be addressed with the Litter Warden by the Clerk.*

Cllr Dunn requested ideas from Councillor as to what type of work and their locations, that the services of the Lengthman's Scheme could undertake.*

Cllr Hoskins had previously raised the clearance of the pavement in Thornford Road in Headley and recently added the clearance of 'Pam's Bridge' in Ashford Hill, which Natural England had been asked to look at.

Cllr Dunn reported that the Westcotec equipment demonstration date continued to be sought.*

Cllr Clark would be representing the Parish Council at planning appeal hearings in October 2023.

Cllr Sunley updated the meeting regarding matters arising from the previous meeting's minutes and confirmed that the logistics of the installation of the new Ashford Hill recreation ground goal posts were in hand.

Cllr Hoskins reported on a number of issues still outstanding that needed to be resolved with Kingsclere Mens' Football Club.

Cllr Hoskins reported on the increased membership of the team of volunteers who undertake the maintenance of footpaths and areas of the recreation grounds. Training for the new volunteers would be required as well as the need for new equipment, the funding of which would be sought from the County Council. In conjunction with the Countryside North Access Team, the volunteers had been working on footpath 710 from Brook Farm/Old Lane to Woodhouse Lane, which was virtually impassable due to flooding and

had a broken stile. Various works had also been completed and were planned within the SSSI areas to improve access for walkers.

9. Recess

The role of the Parish Council in influencing the decisions surrounding large scale developments in the villages was discussed with members of the public and Parish Councillors through the Chair.

10. Financial statement




